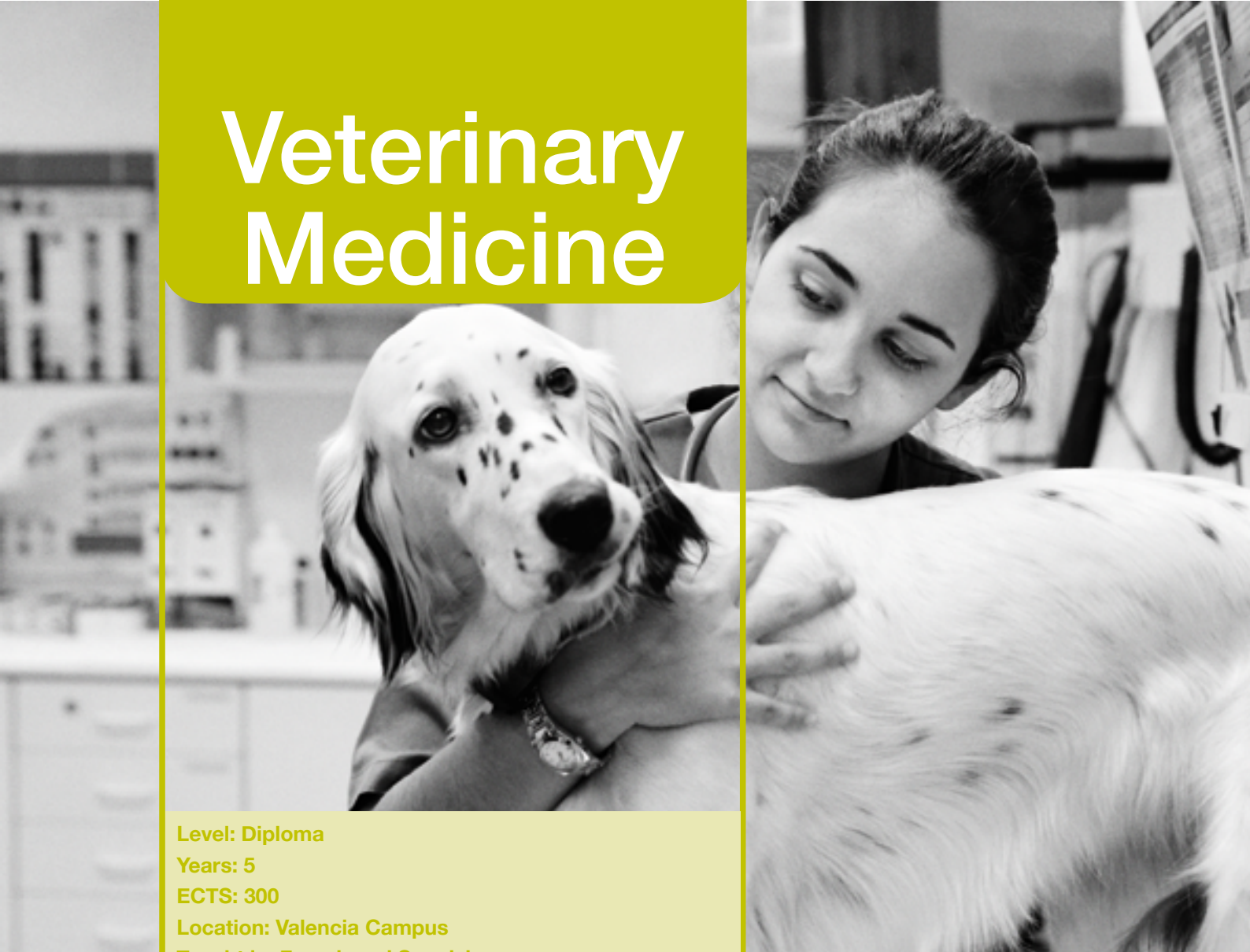

Experience

The faculty of veterinary medicine at UCH-CEU has more than 18 years of experience in training veterinary medicine professionals and received a positive evaluation from ANECA (National Agency for Quality Evaluation and Accreditation), a member of the European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ENQA).

Moreover, according to the classification of the Collèges de Médecine Vétérinaire published by the French newspaper Le Monde, CEU is one of the most important universities in Spain.

Internationalisation

There are currently around 100 international students who have put their faith in us and are taking one of our many veterinary medicine courses. Since its foundation, the university has endeavoured to maintain the open and pluralistic environment which is a key part of its identity. To make our commitment to internationalisation possible, we have international mobility programs and work experience opportunities (International internship programme worldwide, Erasmus Program, Leonardo and the bank of Santander, Association for the mobility of veterinary medicine students). We also have agreements with all the French faculties of veterinary medicine, as well as with the programme 'Improve International', the best higher education institution for veterinary medicine in the UK.

Teaching

The faculty's teaching staff is made up of industry specialists who, between them, have both European and American qualifications. This is considered essential not only for the technical development of students but also their personal development. We pride ourselves on offering students personalised attention, for example through mentoring programs and, as highlighted by 96% of first-year students, this is one of the many benefits of our course.

Facilities

In order to provide the best possible teaching, the veterinary medicine faculty has advanced equipment, for research as well as learning, in addition to the Veterinary Clinic General Hospital which is open 24 hours a day every day of the year. In the hospital, students receive practical training in the clinic and actively participate in daily tasks with specialised professionals, who themselves are teachers of the university. The offices of the hospital and faculty have all the Quality Management System Certification UNE-EN ISO 9001:2008.

Practical Learning

The faculty of veterinary medicine uses a practical teaching approach in the hope that students can gain extensive experience in order to increase their chances of finding a job. To do this, UCH CEU University offers more than 1,000 specialist placements in external sites such as Bioparc and Oceanographic Aquarium in Valencia and we also have more than 400 veterinary professionals involved in teaching at the university. Another advantage of the faculty is the international internship programmes it offers to students, as it benefits from more than 50 signed agreements with professional veterinary clinics and other institutions abroad.

University Life

The University also offers free language services and numerous activities such as the Student Council, the Veterinary Medicine International Week and more, which are offered to all students. In addition, the Veterinary Medicine Faculty has an International Veterinary Medicine Student Association (IVSA) which organises classes, workshops, seminars, exchanges, conferences and many other activities in the IVSA centres all over the world for you to participate in.



National and International Exchange Programmes

You will be able to participate in exchange programmes within Spain with the SICUE-SENECA program, but also further a field in Europe with the ERASMUS+ programme. Likewise, our degree is recognised throughout Europe, which therefore allows you to practice your profession in other countries, such as Morocco.
